Recipe for Section H, Class 78: Lemon and honey muffins

8oz/225g self raising flour sifted	3 tablespoons clear honey
2oz/50g caster sugar	4oz/100g margarine
one large egg	grated rind and juice of one lemon

Icing: 4oz/100g icing sugar, sifted 1½ tbs lemon juice.

Rub margarine into flour and sugar mixture. Add the lemon rind and juice, honey and beaten egg, and mix together. Spoon mixture into paper muffin cases, then bake for 15 to 20 minutes in a moderate oven (350°F/180°/160°(fan)/gas mark 4).

Leave to cool, then coat with lemon icing. Makes 9.

Enter 5 for the Show

Recipe for Section K, Class 100: Lemon biscuits

100g butter	100g caster sugar
1 egg (beaten)	200g plain flour
Grated rind of 1 lemon (you can ask a grown up to help you)	

Beat butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add beaten egg and lemon rind and mix thoroughly. Fold in sifted flour until well mixed. Roll out to ½ cm thick and cut out shapes. Bake in moderate oven (Gas mark 5, electricity 375°F, 190°C) for 10 minutes. Cool and decorate.

RULES

- **All entry forms** and fees must be submitted to the Show Secretary by **9.00 pm on Thursday 2 September 2010**.
- **Please complete a separate form for each exhibitor.**
(The form can be photocopied.)
- All exhibits must have been grown or made by the exhibitor and must not have been entered in the Show in previous years.
- Exhibitors may make only one entry in each class.
- The marquee will open to exhibitors to take their exhibits from **8.00am to 10.45am** on Saturday 4 September and will be cleared for judging at **11.00 am**. Entries will not be accepted after judging has commenced.
- During judging no-one will be allowed in the marquee other than Show Officials.
- The decision of the Judges will be final. They may withhold or diminish any prize, or give an additional prize where it is deserved.
- The Committee will endeavour to protect exhibits but cannot be held responsible for loss or damage to exhibits, or for any personal injury.
- Exhibits and prize money may be collected after **4.00 pm**. Exhibits remaining after the start of the Auction will be placed in the Auction. Prize moneys unclaimed within seven days of the Show will be accepted as donations to the Show.
- Cups and Trophies must be returned to the Show Secretaries directly after the Presentation for engraving of the winner's name. They will be available for collection from the Show Secretaries 10 days later. Winners may then hold them until 21 August next year when they must be returned to the Show Secretaries in a clean condition ready for presentation.
