From Rev Anne.....

WE ARE NOT IN THE SAME BOAT ...

"I heard that we are all in the same boat, but it's not like that. We are in the same storm, but not in the same boat. Your ship could be shipwrecked and mine might not be. Or vice versa.

For some, quarantine is optimal. A moment of reflection, of re-connection, easy in flip flops, with a cocktail or coffee. For others, this is a desperate financial and family crisis.



For some that live alone they are facing endless loneliness. While for others it is peace, rest & time with their mother, father, sons and daughters.

Some are bringing in more money to their households than when they were working. Others are working more hours for less money due to pay cuts or loss in sales. Some families received universal benefit while other families received nothing. Some were concerned about getting a certain chocolate egg for Easter while others were concerned if there would be enough bread, milk and eggs for the weekend.

Some want to go back to work because they don't qualify for unemployment and are running out of money. Others want to kill those who break the quarantine.

Some are home spending 2-3 hours/day helping their child with online schooling while others are spending 2-3 hours/day to educate their children on top of a 10-12 hour workday.

Some have experienced the near death of the virus, some have already lost someone from it and some are not sure if their loved ones are going to make it. Others don't believe this is a big deal.

Some have faith in God and expect miracles during this 2020. Others say the worst is yet to come.

So, friends, we are not in the same boat. We are going through a time when our perceptions and needs are completely different. Each of us will emerge, in our own way, from this storm.

It is important to see beyond what is seen at first glance. Not just looking, but actually seeing. We are all on different ships during this storm experiencing a different journey. Realize that and be kind."

Our District Councillors "View from the Hills"

As what should be the summer holiday period begins, COVID inevitably still dominates. We are in a strange half-world. Local buses are back. Local pubs, shops and other public places are open, but not as they were before March. COVID has been subdued, not beaten, thankfully with MHDC one of the least affected areas in the UK. So far. There is no cause for complacency, as events in Mathon show. Wear a mask when appropriate. You just might be the next carrier of the virus, showing few symptoms, but spreading it to your friends and coworkers.

We will have to live with COVID in terms of what local services can be offered for at least the next year. Most likely for longer as Westminster tries to recoup the huge sums spent supporting the economy. That said, there is positive news. Refurbishment of The Splash leisure centre will happen, and earlier than expected due to continuing lockdown restrictions. MHDC's plans for a greener local economy with less commuting and more homeworking are also very much in favour nationally, but those require more investment in proper broadband and mobile phone connectivity. We continue to press for both.

Those affected by February's floods are not forgotten. A massive scheme to provide flood alleviation measures in the Severn and Teme catchments was announced in early July. That includes grants of up to £10,000 to increase individual properties' flood resilience. Doubtless of interest to residents of Knightwick and Bransford.

My income has dropped due to coronavirus and I'm struggling to keep up with all of my bills. I rent my house from a private landlord and pay all the usual bills - electricity, water, and Council Tax. How best can I juggle them, and is there any help I can get from the government?



If your income is reduced because of coronavirus, you should check whether you're entitled to sick pay or to claim benefits.

You can check your eligibility for both sick pay and benefits on the <u>Citizens Advice</u> <u>website</u>. If you're already on existing benefits, <u>these might also increase</u>.

If you're struggling to pay rent, talk to your landlord straight away. You should explain the situation and could ask for more time to pay, a temporary reduction in rent, or ask to catch up any missed payments by instalments. If you contact your nearest Citizens Advice an adviser can help you explain things to your landlord. If you can't come to an agreement with your landlord, it's a good idea to pay what you can afford and keep a record of what you offered.

The government passed an emergency law which means landlords have to give you three months notice to end certain tenancy types from 26 March. The court service has suspended all possession action for 90 days from 27 March. This means that even if you have been served a notice for eviction it's unlikely it can be enforced during this time. You can find out more about what to do if you're being evicted for rent arrears on the <u>Citizens Advice website</u>.

If you already claim Housing Benefit, you should tell the council your income has reduced. If you don't claim it already, you might be entitled to help with housing costs from the government.

When it comes to your utilities, you should contact the provider as soon as possible. Depending on the type of bill, they may be able to arrange a payment plan, or have schemes in place for people in financial hardship. You should also talk to your local council, as your income has changed you might be entitled to a council tax reduction.

If you're struggling to pay multiple bills, it's important to sort out what's known as 'priority bills' like energy bills or council tax over credit card bills. This is because the immediate consequences of not paying these things are much more serious. Citizens Advice website can help you with this.



Vandalism at the Fold

A fundraising campaign has been launched to replace a £10,000 sculpture destroyed by vandals at a nature trail near Worcester. The sculpture, Eve, from the Fold in Bransford was destroyed on Thursday night (June 25) after vandals tore the sculpture off its plinth and smashed it up. A Crowdfunding page has been set up for the

community to donate cash to replace the 5 ft. tall statue which overlooked the lake.

Owner, William Tooby, said he was "gutted" by the destruction of Eve, adding: "I cherish this land, and I love to share it with everyone, so to see it violated in this way makes me realise how far we, the human race, have yet to travel. I'm pleased so many people have been enjoying this beautiful countryside during the hot weather, but so many visitors have raised concerns with Eve being smashed and so much litter being left on the land. Villagers in Bransford have complained about groups of youngsters parking on the verge by The Bank House Hotel and heading down to the River Teme at the Fold for parties. Fold staff have had to clear up litter and other debris is left behind and the vandalism of Eve has further angered the community.

Operations manager Chloe Mackean said: "We all feel very upset by it. Everyone is devastated. There have been so many people using the nature trail, it's been very popular. However, it's a different sort of people using it now. People are drinking, having parties and listening to loud music and leaving their litter. We are doing our best with litter picking and have installed a donation box in the car park. For Eve to be vandalised after people have been leaving their litter over the whole area, it seems like the last straw. Due to the extent of the damage, the statue cannot be repaired, so instead the business is asking for contributors to think of an idea for a replacement sculpture." Chloe added: "We will be so grateful for any contribution we receive. The support and the response we've had from the community has been phenomenal."

The team are aiming to raising £5,000.

1. REOPENING THE HALL

Following an extraordinary meeting of the trustees on Monday evening, July 13th we are delighted to announce that the Hall will be reopening on **Saturday August 1**st. For the two weeks before reopening we have been engaged in extensive preparations to ensure that the building and grounds comply with the latest (and continually updated) guidelines for reopening Community Venues.

Of course the very nature of the virus means that even after following all the current reopening guidance, reopening any community venue building will never be entirely risk free. 2. FRIENDS OF LEIGH & BRANSFORD FUND RAISING

Thanks to everyone who continues to support our annual fund raising scheme by paying their subscriptions by standing order. We have started doorstep collections of subscriptions and will hope to have them all collected by the end of August. Monthly draws are up to date and all winners continue to be notified. 3. IN MEMORY OF NORMAN KIMBER

Many people in the Parish will remember Norman Kimber, a former Chair of Trustees of the Hall who was brought up in Leigh Sinton. We were recently contacted by a firm of solicitors in Bristol to advise that Norman has sadly passed away, but generously left a legacy of £10,000 to support the Hall. In the mid to late 1980s, having moved back to Leigh Sinton, he was very eager to get involved in the village community where he grew up and quickly joined the Hall's management committee – later taking over as Chair. In 1987, a legacy of £11,500 left to the Hall by Albert Jones (a local farmer) was the initial financial stimulus for his vision to modernise and extend the original building – culminating in the construction of a second, larger hall with stage. He wanted to ensure that the Hall's facilities were improved for the benefit of our community well into the future. He worked extremely hard to plan, organise and project manage the addition of the new hall. As such, Norman encouraged many other local villagers to get involved and together with Ron and Cath Hall was also co-founder of the Indoor Bowls Club which is still running today.

The trustees send their sincere condolences and thanks to his family for such a generous legacy. We will use it to honour his memory and to celebrate the vision he had almost 40 years ago which has given our community such a lasting and valuable parish asset.



Notes from Alfrick & Lulsley Parish Council Meeting on Thursday 23 July 2020.

This was the first meeting of the council since the end of February and the institution of 'lock-down' and the first to be held under the provisions of The Local Authorities and Police and Crime Panels (Coronavirus) (Flexibility of Local Authority and Police and Crime Panel Meetings) (England and Wales) Regulations 2020.

The meeting was held electronically using ZOOM software. Parishioners who wish to take part in these internet based meetings can do so by applying to the clerk of the council for an access key. They will need to have ZOOM software running on their computer which can be downloaded free from ZOOM.

Prior to the formal agenda County Cllr P Tuthill reported on the activities of the Worcestershire Acute Hospitals NHS Trust, the Hereford and Worcester Fire and Rescue Service and answered questions on WCC activities.

District ClIrs Ms S Rouse and P Whatley reported on the activities of the MHDC during the pandemic emergency noting that in the area the rate of infection was considerably below the national average.

A Resignation from the Council

The Chair advised that he had received a letter of resignation from Cllr Ms B Brown. The council noted her resignation and asked the clerk to put in process the co-option of a replacement. Members also asked the clerk to write to Ms Brown expressing their thanks to her for her contribution to the life of the village.

The council now wishes to co-opt a parishioner to fill the vacancy left by Cllr Brown's resignation. It is hoped that a candidate for co-option will come forward by the next meeting on 24 September. If you or someone you know is interested in joining the council in its work for the parishes please contact the clerk to the council for details. (geoffreymbrewin@waitrose.com)

Financial Matters

The council formally approved the Council's Accounts 2019-20, the formal Annual Governance Statement and the formal Annual Statement of Accounts as required by the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014. The clerk advised that the formal notice of Public Rights to view the accounts would be posted on 27/7/2020 and the inspection period would be from 1/9/2020 to 12/10/2020.

Planning and Environmental Matters

The council considered Application No: 20/00943/FUL, The Grange, Alfrick, for the change of use, conversion and extension of a pigsty to one-bed holiday accommodation, and agreed to support this application as it brought into use redundant buildings and would contribute to the general wellbeing and economy of the parish.

Committee on New Public Facilities

The Committee Chair, Cllr A Cooper, reported on the plans of this committee so far.

Firstly it has decided that building a Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) would be of benefit to all. It would have a 5-a-side football pitch, tennis court, basketball and we hope a cricket net. Obviously, the existing tennis club will move onto this, and we hope that the football club will take some time on it and possibly walking football. This is to be sited roughly where the existing tennis court is.

Secondly a children's play area will be put in the playing field.

Thirdly a selection of outdoor exercise equipment will be arranged round the perimeter of the field, linked by a tarmac pathway to enable people to take exercise on the field throughout the year, even when it is wet.

This week two companies visited to discuss our needs and measure up so we can get a precise quotation. The budget is £90,000.

We are now turning our thoughts to what happens when it is built and how does it run.

We propose to sub-let the MUGA to a newly formed A&L Sports Club, or such, whose committee would have at least two members from the Parish Council plus other interested parties.

The children's play area and exercise equipment will be open to use 24/7 and 365 days a year.

The next meeting of the council will be Thursday 24 September 2020 at 19:30 hrs. via ZOOM



We do hope that all our friends and supporters have remained well and safe during these very trying times.

Under Government guidelines, we are now able to re-open the Hall and we intend to do so from **1 August**. Unfortunately, we are still unable to hold any of our usual events, but we can invite our hiring groups to use the Hall again should they wish to do so. Since the numbers involved in our hiring groups are relatively small, we feel sure that they can safely distance. The Committee

skills to those not yet digitally connected. We will encourage and enable digital communication skills, especially for the vulnerable and elderly. Social distancing is easy here, but keeping alert to our neighbours' and each other's wellbeing requires us to engage with each other in new ways as well as old. For Suckley residents effectively to meet the challenges of this present pandemic era we need to strengthen our local identity and maintain our community spirit. Together we will improve the quality of life for many.

What we'll deliver:

- Purchase 500 A5 quality printed card information folders to hold loose sheets (c £340)
- Create and source the information sheets for the above folders donation
- Create a 'bank' of donated iPads & train new Digital Champions donations
- Enable new volunteers to have DBS checks

Why it's a great idea:

- 1) All Suckley residents will have a durable attractive and up to date folder with information and contact details for all their local needs and more.
- 2) Suckley and nearby businesses and craftsmen will benefit from knowing that their A5 fliers could reach all residents and probably be kept and updated and attract more local business.
- 3) New volunteers will be encouraged to join the *Good Neighbour Scheme*. They may then enjoy the satisfaction of further GNS training (CLV training by *Citizens Advice* and Digital Champion training by *LearnMyWay*)
- 4) COVID self-isolation has emphasised the disadvantages for those who are not digitally connected. Our volunteers will be enabled to help bring digital connectivity to those who would benefit from the new social interaction and interest that this brings.
- 5) Suckley's scattered community will be encouraged to work together and thus equip themselves better to deal with challenges like COVID self-isolation and geographical social isolation.

Steps to get it done:

- Designing the cover of the new leaflet folder
- Contacting local businesses and craftsmen etc., to provide information leaflets
- Achieving a DBS for every new GNS volunteer

Suckley is an unusually vulnerable community comprising a sprawling mix of farms and scattered hamlets where challenges include:

- 1) Social deprivation. 25% of households live alone and there is an increasingly elderly demographic.
- 2) Connectivity deprivation. Mobile phone and internet coverage is variable and unreliable.
- 3) Services deprivation. We are in the lowest 5% in the country in terms of barriers to Services.
- 4) **Suckley Good Neighbour Scheme** has a tried and tested infrastructure (useful multi-skilled volunteers accessible via GNS email and local telephone number).
- 5) Working with local Councillors and the local PO and Stores, and supported by local social networking,

Suckley community coped well through the challenges of the first COVID peak. Volunteers enabled an effective delivery service for shopping and other supplies. Now is an excellent opportunity for new local folk to enjoy the rewards of volunteering to foster community cohesion and strengthen community spirit.

News from Suckley Parish Annual Council Meeting held 13 July 2020

Due to Covid 19 restrictions, Suckley Parish Council held its first Zoom meeting on 13 July.

This was the Annual Meeting of the Council which is normally held in May. Cllr Peter Whatley was reelected as Chairman and Cllr John Green re-elected as Vice-Chairman.

COUNTY COUNCILLOR - Co Cllr Paul Tuthill reported to the meeting. In order to meet the demands placed on it by the Covid 19 pandemic, the hospital had set aside areas for Covid patients, and separate areas for other patients needing care. Kidderminster hospital had been designated for chemotherapy treatments. At the time of his report, the numbers of Covid deaths for Worcestershire were 500 – 300 of these in hospital and 200 elsewhere. At this stage the average deaths per week were 160 compared to the normal average figure of 110. Worcestershire County Council, together with District and Parish Councils, had been working hard to cope with the pandemic, with most employees working from home. WCC had set up a *Here to Help* single telephone number for people to use throughout the County. The new cycling and walking bridge was now in place across The Hams at Powick.

pistrict councillor - Dist Clir Sarah Rouse reported to the meeting and thanked everyone for all their hard work and support during the lockdown period. Malvern Hills District Council had done very well – especially the bin men. Economy was the key going forward, and a County wide economic recovery plan was being put together. Tenbury Wells was still suffering from flooding problems. The local plan had been delayed due to the pandemic. She was on the Committee to deal with the Covid break-out at a local farm in Mathon. Homeless people had been provided with secure

accommodation during the lockdown and the Council was working hard to keep them secure and off the streets for the future.

FINANCE - The Year End Accounts to 31 March had been internally audited and were approved by the Council.

community - Clirs Anne Lewis and Liz Devenish are pushing ahead with a superfast broadband project for the Crews Hill area of the Parish. However, little progress was being made in Longley Green as Openreach were adamant that the Bruff Business Centre has to be included in the scheme (despite very little interest from the businesses on that site). Clir P Whatley is taking this matter up with Openreach and the WCC representative. Clir Anne Lewis reported that so far £250 has been raised for the Good Neighbour Scheme/Parish Information Pack through a match funded Crowdfunding project backed by MHDC.

PLAYING FIELD - Yet again a break-in has occurred at the Playing Field Pavilion with damage being caused to the door. This has now been secured and a metal security grate will be installed. Due to Covid restrictions the Play Area and play equipment had been taped off and Closed notices put up. However, the tapes and notices have been removed. Photographs of the measures taken have been made, and notices etc., will be replaced. The Play Area is officially closed and should not be used.



Safe in Suckley?

There is so much mixed messaging coming out in print, interviews and actions (Boris wearing a mask when visiting a hair salon, but Rishi failing to do so when serving meals to customers). Masks are mandatory in shops in Scotland but not, at the time of writing, in England. And what about "Social Distancing" and the "One Metre + rule"? Such a small symbol that "+" but such huge implications. Social media doesn't help, and clearly the behaviour of many says; "why bother?" Why bother? They think it's all over. It isn't. When writing this I have heard of an outbreak of 73 cases of Covid-19 just 4.5 miles from here, and my Covid-19 app from Prof Spector's team at Kings College Hospital tells me that today there are 1,471 daily NEW cases of Covid-19 in the UK and 25,000 current cases. Clearly outbreaks are more common when people are together for longer periods of time inside in confined spaces (meat and veg packing, sweat shops, religious gatherings). Globally the situation is even more dramatic, as seen from the chart below from the World Health Organisation this morning, showing that cases are exponentially rising across the world. In February there appeared to be a massive outbreak in China, (magenta on left of the chart below) but that is now dwarfed by the rise in the Americas (orange), and SE Asia (purple) while Europe has fallen a little (limegreen). This chart represents just the 12.5 million cases that we know about, but no one knows how many cases are not documented, especially in Africa. There are also over 0.5 million known deaths. So, there is no reason to be complacent. If, from that "little blip" in China in February, we all found ourselves in lockdown in March, just consider the risk we face today from the absolutely massive numbers of cases in the world.

Why bother? Because you just do not want to get this virus even if you are young. We know that the older you are the greater the risk of death. Compared to a 50-year-old you are over twice as likely to die if you are over 60yrs, over 7 times as likely over 70yrs and 26 times as likely over 80yrs. (*OpenSAFELY* study of over 17 million people in England). But it is not just death that is the concern. Evidence just coming in from Italy indicates that even those who had a 'mild' infection in all age groups are getting mental, neurological, kidney, cardiac and other problems, some of which may be long term problems. This is not just a respiratory infection; it affects the whole body.

If we needed to go into lockdown in March, with relatively few cases in the world, how can we avoid the 'second spike' or the third with so many cases globally, especially when the economic impact of lockdown demands that we open up? Well, it is up to us and our behaviour as a society. That little "+" in "One metre +" cannot be ignored. It does not mean we are safe if we are just a little over one metre away from each other, it means it is ONLY safe under 2 metres if we put other things in place to protect ourselves. Masks/face coverings are the main thing available to protect yourself and others if you enter somewhere where you cannot be sure of being at least 2 metres distanced such as a shop, pub, restaurant, religious gathering etc. This short video is very good at explaining why face coverings work:

Boris wore a mask after Prof Anthony Costello, a former director of the *World Health Organisation*, criticised Rishi for not doing so. Branding it a"terrible mistake" the professor of global health said; "Our

message is to wear masks indoors, wear masks in public places – and ministers should be setting a good example". It is not macho to be seen without a mask. We are not somehow immune from infection just because we live in rural Worcestershire.

It is only by everyone being responsible; by remaining socially distanced (2 metres if possible) and wearing masks in public places and indoors when mixing with others from outside our "bubble", and by washing/sanitising our hands that we are going to be able to protect ourselves and to protect our society. This is not just a personal responsibility; it is the only way we as a society are going to avoid this disease getting out of hand again. After all, 92 people out of every 100 in the UK have not yet had this. So, until a vaccine that works becomes available

(if that ever happens, which is by no means certain), we need to find a safe sustainable way of living with this virus.



Friends in my Garden

Today it is raining, which is welcome news for gardeners, and everything is looking refreshed and healthier. However like many other people, I have been spending more time than usual in the garden, and it recently occurred to me that many of the plants have special memories of family and friends.

A lovely perfumed rose (a house-warming gift 20 years ago) climbs round our bedroom window, and a beautiful pink Gertrude Jekyll rose, also a house-warming gift, rambles through an old cherry tree. Another old pear tree is the host for Bantry Bay, a pretty rose given to us by my sisters on one of our wedding anniversaries. From the study window we can see a

flower bed where I have planted all the bowls of hyacinths given to me by our grandchildren when they were small, and this provides a very colourful display of blue, pale and deep pink and white - not to mention the delicious perfume. There are daffodils in the orchard bought with a 'thank you' gift voucher.

In a big pot by the front door is a stunning blue hydrangea, a gift from friends on our 50th wedding anniversary, and I have several large pots of blue and white agapanthus which we bought as small cuttings from Madeira. There are poppies everywhere in the summer, originally from seed pods collected from friends' gardens, and violets, wallflowers and sweet peas remind me of my mother.

Two 'love birds' swivel around in the breeze, reminding us of a happy weekend in Devon with good friends a few years ago when we visited a beautiful National Trust garden, and of course 'Shaun the Sheep' (the one with the brown face) enjoys 'grazing' on the lawn (a gift from lovely Inner Wheel ladies last time I was club President).

I won't bore you further but I think you have the picture, and realise that our garden is very special to me. All the above plants, and many more, have individual memories, and provide me with company when I am gardening, and even when in lock-down, we are surrounded by friends and family, all with a tale to tell.
