We had a successful Plant stall and Preserves stall along with our own Raffle, Garden Book stall and selling of plant donations. It should be noted that we were supported by a number of local suppliers for the food, notably Drew's of Little Witley for tomatoes, Croome Cuisine cheese, Legges of Bromyard for Ham and Loafers of Bromyard, artisan bread maker.

To add extra interest we offered a number of gardens with a classic or historic car. This proved a talking point and of particular note were the very rare 1935 Frazer Nash BMW, and the enormous American 1961 pink Cadillac with the Gardeners being asked "ooh, is that yours!"

Everyone enjoyed their day with lots of lovely comments about the friendliness of the open gardeners and residents that visitors met during the day and in true 'Alfrick' style we were also able to reunite lost property and find a set of car keys!

We are currently consulting with our open gardeners with a view to opening next year and then biannually to put us back to our original pattern and avoid clashing with other local open gardens.

We are very thankful to all that supported the day and help us raise such a wonderful amount.
